There are day care facilities for those in the nearby community. Facilities include two TV lounges, plus a lounge without TV, with a regular activities programme, including handicrafts. Residents can choose to retain their own GP and a dentist, chiropodist and hairdresser visit regularly. Ecumenical and communion services are held and there is a Residents Committee.  There is a Day Centre which is open four days a week where social activities and general socialising take place.

<b>Comment:</b>	<p>Library clubs are available in many parts of the County as a way of bringing housebound people to the library. Where these clubs exist, transport to the library is provided and people usually visit the library once a month. The clubs are held monthly, and serve over three hundred housebound people. Most club meetings last around ninety minutes - some held while the library is closed to the general public, some are held when the library is open.</p> <p>Staff are always on hand, with volunteers to assist and support. They can accommodate wheelchair users and people with sensory loss. Customers can have a cup of tea and a chat while they choose their books.</p> <p>If you are interested in this idea, ask the librarian whether a club operates in your area or click on the link to the Gloucestershire libraries web page and follow the links from there.</p>
